- Responsible for independently raising and managing funds required for main-stage productions as well as for all additional Thespian related activities. Expenses typically exceed \$90,000.00 annually and have never ended in the red or been the subject of audit exceptions.
- Provide opportunities for inclusivity in Arts Education through embracing the diverse backgrounds of all students regardless of disability, race, gender, sexual orientation, identity, or native language.
- Specialize in Theatre for The Deaf
- Facilitated the establishment of the SPHS Friends of The Theatre, an independent incorporated parent booster organization, which annually awards senior scholarships, successfully secures community grant funding for the school and the program, and works closely with school and district personnel representing the needs of the theatre students and community at SPHS
- Regularly promote the image of the theatre program and the school by hosting district personnel and notable community leaders including the superintendent of schools, local school board members, and community leaders at major theatrical productions.
- Promote student retention and enrollment through networking with local feeder elementary and middle school students by incorporating them into productions and hosting their annual functions such as chorus concerts, band concerts, drama productions, etc.
- Mentor for South Florida CAPPIES (a high school theatre writing and awards program).
